HUGE BOOST FOR KISII IN REHAB PROGRAMS



he National Authority for Campaign against Alcohol and Drug Abuse (NACADA) has officially handed over the Kiamwasi Rehabilitation Centre in Kitutu Chache South to the Kisii County Government. The facility, which is 80 percent complete, will help the county and its neighbours address the escalating cases of alcohol and drug abuse among the youth.

NACADA CEO, Victor
Okioma, called for
collaborative efforts in
combating the trend and
urged governors and
political leaders to
shoulder more
responsibility and save the
youth from the menace.

"Counties have been thrust into the frontline to begin addressing proliferation and subsequent abuse of alcohol and drugs. With regards to this facility, we have invested nine million

shillings in its construction while the Kisii County Government contributed thirteen million.

As NACADA, we are committed to forging partnerships with county governments with a view to dealing with this problem," he said.

Kisii County Governor **James Ongwae**, while receiving the facility, vouched for the potential utility of the centre, lauding it as a life-changer, especially for the addicts and their families.

"We hope this facility would not only help in mending lives but also give skills to those who will pass through it. It is not going to be a place of rest. Alcohol is known to impair many a people's lives and contributes to most lifestyle diseases, which can be avoided. We are thus bound to see increased productivity, which will in turn affect economic growth with the operationalization of this rehabilitation center," he observed.

The county government, he divulged, intends to inject more cash into the construction of the **Kiamwasi Dispensary**, which is also 80 percent complete and adjacent to the rehabilitation facility. The Governor said that the two facilities will complement each other in service delivery to the people of Kisii County and the larger South Nyanza region.

ADVANCING COLLABORATION AMONG ARMS OF GOVERNMENT

he Executive has undertaken to enhance the infrastructural capacity of the Judiciary in a deliberate effort to improve administration of justice. Dr. Fred Matiang'i has said there are government facilities already available for sharing, which will improve judicial administration and accommodation of judges.

Speaking during forum of the National Council on the Administration of Justice (NCAJ) chaired by Chief Justice, Martha Koome, the Cabinet Secretary said the Executive will soon initiate the release of vacant government houses in Nairobi, Kisumu, and Mombasa for this purpose.

"From today, let's work together to ensure judges are properly housed. Houses don't belong to the Executive Arm of Government," he said, adding that such constructive collaboration and engagement does not amount to compromise.

On her part, the Chief Justice restated the urgent need for a collaborative and complementary approach to service delivery by all the arms of government owing to the overlapping jurisdictions and shared responsibilities among them.

She said, "This does not mean that our agencies are not independent; but it is out of the reality that it is only through coordination of our activities that we can attain efficiency and resolve systemic problems in the pursuit of our common goal of effective delivery of services to Kenyans."

The meeting was also attended by AG Kihara Kariuki, IG Hillary Mutyambai, DPP Noordin Haji, DCI George Kinoti, EACC CEO Twalib Mubarak, Ministry of ICT CAS Maureen Mbaka among other key players in the Governance, Justice, Law and Order Sector (GJLOS).
